"For the bitter and the sweet"

"For the honey and the bee sting, for the bitter and the sweet" Naomi Shemer's song *Al Kol Eileh*, asks God to protect everything acknowledging that in life there is both bitter and sweet.

We have the sweetness of honey in our history along with pain and bitterness. The manna that the Israelites ate in the wilderness tasted like honey over wafers. Honey is compared to Torah and wisdom. In Psalm 19:11, Torah is seen as more precious than fine gold, and sweeter than honey. Rashi, the medieval commentator, on Psalm 24:13, states: "It is customary for people to eat honey because it is good; so too know wisdom for your soul, and just as you run to eat honey, so should you run to know wisdom."

We wish each other a sweet new year because we want the coming year to be happy and to be fruitful. We know that we can look back on any year and see both the bitter and the sweet. We know when we gather for the High Holidays, we will bring both the bitter and the sweet. Those things that we regret, that we want to change will be the bitter. Those things that we are most proud of, that we hope to repeat will be the sweet. That is the nature of the work at this time of year.

- **ONE** huge project to manage (while saying goodbye to ONE Senior Rabbi and welcoming ONE Interim Rabbi.)
- **TWO** invaluable helpers (Robin Morris and Jeff Sloan), whose help, work ethic and expertise made this transition possible.
- **THREE** key staff members (Jenny Labow, Jory Budd and Kelsey Holder) whose patience, packing skills, and positivity made the work accomplished in the month of June happen.
- **FOUR** weeks of packing (with help from our wonderful lay leaders)!
- **FIVE** days of moving (July 7,8,9,10 and 11), with temperatures in the high 90's!
- **SIX** more weeks of me selling items on Facebook Marketplace after the garage sale.
- **SEVEN** worthy non-profit organizations to which we made donations, including Zarrow Pointe, Mizel Jewish Community Day School, Habitat for Humanity, Salvation Army, Marshall School, Friends of the Helmerich Library, and Phillips Theological Seminary Library.

In looking back over this busy time, I am grateful that our garage sale provided our members with the opportunity to purchase small “Temple Israel Treasures” to enjoy and take home. I am grateful for the opportunity to support deserving non-profits, particularly Mizel Jewish Community Day School and Zarrow Pointe, whose generosity towards us have been unmatched as we settle into our temporary office space on the Zarrow campus. I am grateful for the opportunity to add funds to the Next Dor project. All told we raised a total of \$18,877 for Temple Israel with our efforts, which will help fund the playground in our new building.

We are now settled in our new office space and are busy preparing for the reflective time of the High Holy Days. I want to sincerely thank every member of our Temple Israel Family who helped us during this time of transition. As we move into 5786, my hope is for a year of peace and productivity. As always, we continue to strive to provide each member of our Temple Israel community opportunities to connect, learn, grow and worship. Please join us! 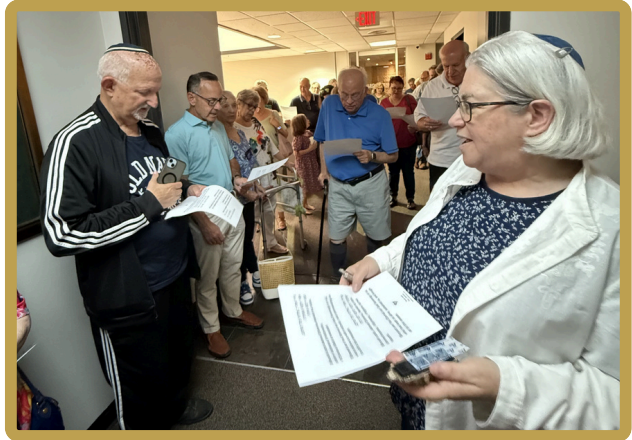

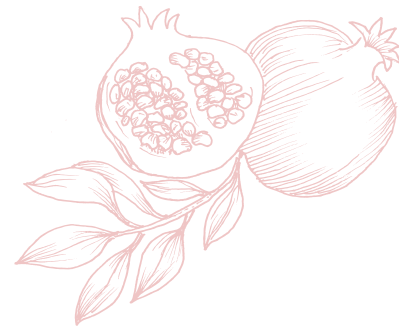

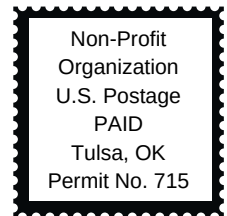
