## RABBI REMARKS

Ecclesiastes writes: "...the making of many books is without limit". [Ecclesiastes 12:12] In our time it isn't just books that have proliferated; the different media of learning have expanded greatly. There are so many more channels for us to learn anything under the sun.

We still have books, both physical and digital. We can learn from a teacher in person or watch a video online. We can listen to an audiobook or a Podcast. We can have a *chevruta*, a study partner, who is in the same room or who is remote. We can travel to places to learn, and we can engage in digital learning platforms.

As we prepare for Shavu'ot, the Festival of the giving of Torah at Mount Sinai, we will have two different media for learners. Part of Shavu'ot, beyond the eating of dairy products, is to prepare to receive Torah by engaging in learning through the night, a practice known as *Tikkun Leil Shavu'ot*. This year we will have two different media for learning. On Thursday, May 21, at 6:30 p.m., we will gather in the Activity Space at the Temple Israel offices for learning. Together we will explore "How Many Commandments Are There?". We will look at the 10 Commandments and other lists of commandments from the rabbinic tradition. We will also be serving cheese as well as cheesecake.

That same evening, we are participating in "It's Torah O'clock Somewhere", a project of small congregations across North America. Beginning at 7 p.m. CDT until 9 a.m. CDT on Friday, May 22, there are almost 30 learning sessions with rabbis across North America via Zoom. At each hour, there can be as many as five different classes to choose from. I will be teaching as part of that program, at 9 pm CDT. My topic will be "Sacred Texts & Unclean Hands" online. This class explores rabbinic debates about which books belong in the Tanakh. Using Tractate Megillah, we'll examine how the idea of texts that "defile the hands" signaled sacred status, and what criteria shaped the boundaries of the Hebrew canon. Watch the iTinerary for details and the links that will be provided soon.

# TREASURER'S UPDATE

It may surprise you that dues cover only about 25% of our \$1.6 million annual budget. A natural question follows: how do we fund the remaining 75%? The answer is through a combination of donations, fundraisers, and support from our Foundation. While we work hard to manage expenses responsibly and run a disciplined budget, dues alone are not enough to sustain everything our Temple provides.



When I first reviewed our financials as Treasurer, I was surprised to learn how much we rely on these additional sources. They are essential to maintaining our programs, supporting our staff, and sustaining our community.

Our Foundation plays a particularly important role, but it is meant to support generations of congregants over the long term. In recent years, we have relied more heavily on it than is ideal, in part due to rising upkeep and maintenance costs of our previous building. One of the goals of our new building is to reduce those ongoing costs and help preserve the Foundation for the future, as continuing to rely on this level of support from the Foundation in the long run is not sustainable.

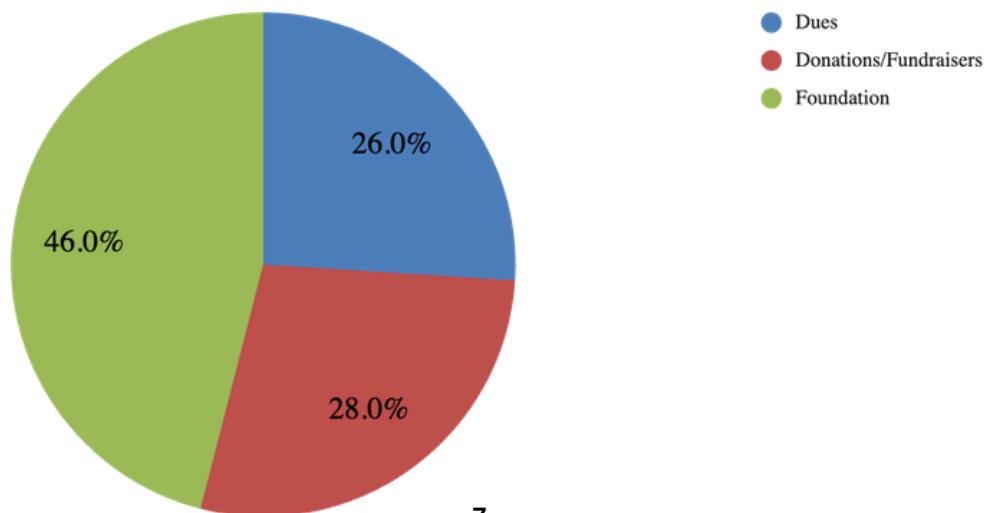
At the end of the day, our Temple is sustained by our community—through dues, donations, and participation.

- Support our Annual Fundraiser on May 3, 2026.

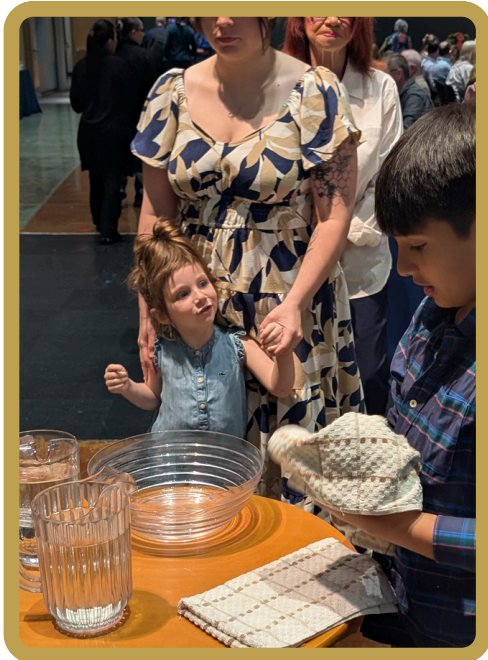

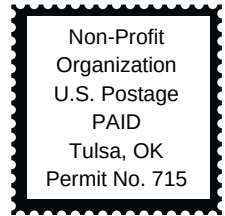
